National Student Bursary Award Winners- CAFP Conference

The CAFP National Bursary Program awards bursaries to students who are enrolled in culinary, supervisory, managerial and Dietetic diploma or degree programs across Canada. Bursaries are granted to the most deserving students, based on selection guidelines established by the association. Our National Bursaries assist students who are pursuing studies and eventually a career in the Hospitality, Food Service or the Dietetic profession. The following are Toronto Branch students who were recognized for their many achievements:

Campbell's Bursary
